JUNE 2022



This June, we're going to be spending time in the book of Acts. "The Acts of the Apostles" picks up the story after the resurrection, describing how Christ's Church went from a small group of disciples to a movement consisting of gatherings of the faithful around the Mediterranean. We see how sharing the good news of Jesus takes such precedence for them that they stop at nothing to do so. We see Peter step into his role as leader as they live out their new Easter-shaped lives. We see that while Jesus is not with them in the same way, the Holy Spirit guides them forward in ways that Jesus in a human body could not.

The book could more correctly be titled "The Acts of the Holy Spirit." And we know that the Holy Spirit continues to move Christ's Church. The Spirit continues to guide us to live out our discipleship in our time and place. As we seek to discern what focus we should have in the next three to five years, it is this Spirit that we turn to for guidance.

By spending time in the book of Acts, we'll be reminded how the Holy Spirit works. We'll have the example of the Early Church as we seek to discern what the Holy Spirit is leading us to do. We'll be reminded that we can indeed trust the Spirit to act and can expectantly watch for it.

While the sermons through the month of June will be from Acts, there is much more in the book than what could be covered in four sermons. I therefore encourage you to spend time in Acts in your own as well. Here are some ideas to help you:

- Start with the book of Luke, which is "part 1" of the greater work which includes Acts as "part 2." At least, compare the first several verses of both books to see how they're connected.
- If you can, read through it in one sitting, as this can help you follow the flow of the narrative.
- If you don't have time to read it, listen to it! (www.biblegateway.com/audio.)
- Get a study partner to help hold each other accountable.
- Find a good map of Paul's journeys to help you get a sense of where he went.
- Dive deeper into Acts with an online study or borrow a commentary from me. (Search online for "The Bible Project: Acts.") Though remember, it's not so much about learning about the book of Acts, but about learning about God as revealed through the book.

This is one of the most exciting books of the bible, and the most exciting part is knowing that we can understand ourselves as living out the most recent chapter in this ongoing story.

Don't miss out on this Spirit-filled activity!

SMLC, BLC JOINT COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS MAY 2022

Pastor Report:

- Pastor emailed the councils his report. He asked for feedback about the new liturgy. We said we like it but find it confusing for some people going back and forth from the bulletin to the Now the Feast pamphlet. It was decided the worship committees need to meet to see how this can be made easier.
- Strategic Planning Process: It's good to have started this process! The initial "Looking Back" conversations are on their way, with Bethel having theirs on May 22nd. I then plan to do a preaching series in June taking a look at the book of Acts to help us recognize the Spirit's guidance as we listen for the Spirit guiding our next steps. This will conclude with a survey asking everyone to answer two questions: "What has God shaped us to do well?" And "What might God be leading us to do now?" We will then take and process that information.
- Since I'll be staying at Bethlehem on May 22nd, Pr. Paul Shoop will be covering for me at St. Martin.
- **Visit from Bishop:** Bishop Lee Miller is confirmed to join us on May 29th. He will preach and will be available for questions in the short time before and after worship. The focus will mostly be to show the Bishop who we are as he seeks to better know the synod.
- Feedback on New Liturgy and combined bulletin: I think the combined bulletin has been a success in bringing us closer together as a congregation, as well as making it easier on my worship planning. The current plan is to return to separate bulletins for the Early Pentecost season.
- We're three weeks into the new liturgy. It's definitely taken some work to get used to it. I'm overall glad how it is going, but would be interested in hearing Council's feedback.
- The Councils decided to continue to use a mutual bulletin.

Laurie Brigden will not be putting the announcements in the bulletin, instead they will be given to Nancy at St. Martin to include in the weekly messenger. We need to have BLC announcements to Nancy by Wednesday's.

OLD BUSINESS:

The next meeting for Vacation Bible school is June 18th.

- Sizes are needed for the T-shirts to be ordered.
- Sarah Frick will be handling the finances for VBS
- Christmas stockings- BLC needs to get the collection box in the Narthex and envelopes in the pews. Carol's daughter-in-law had a fundraiser and collected \$1,595. There is already \$4,000 in the fund.

NEW BUSINESS:

- St. Pauly Shed would like for BLC to have a shed on the property. St. Martin already has one and it does great and generates some income. BLC will find out more information and discuss it.
- BLC will no longer pay a share for Nancy, from St. Martin, for doing the newsletter since Laurie Brigden is doing the bulletin for both churches.

Treasurer's report: Sandy reported- We received the audit form from the synod so we are ready to begin the audit.

- Our free will offering gathered one Sunday and our Lenten offering totaled \$672.89 and was donated to the crisis in Ukraine.
- The Easter offering totaled \$165.00 and will be donated to Camp Good Days and special Times.
- Laurie Brooks motioned to approve the Treasurer's report and Laurie Brigden seconded it and the report was approved.

Worship: Sandy asked Lorrilyn Schlinger and Steve Borkhuis to train the children who are interested to be acolytes.

- Laurie Brigden will compose a schedule for the deacons.
- PROPERTY: All reported the cost of the drop off concrete pad is \$6,5000 with the increase in pad size. We need to pay 20% down, \$1,300 and \$5,200 when completed.
- Exterior painting will start when the weather permits.

Outreach: The Easter offering will go to Camp Good Days and Special Times. Our congregation has several people battling cancer, therefore we felt this is an appropriate charity for our church to help.

Faith Formation: Wednesday evening bible study will not continue during the summer, starting this week.

Youth: Laurie Brooks reported the Sunday school tea party was successful. The kids enjoyed treats, fellowship and making a Mother's Day craft. Youth group members, Abby Frick and Harleigh Simmons assisted the younger kids.


Old Business: New technology has not progressed. If we get a computer soon we may use the camera we already purchased for now.
